From the President's Desk...

AMSOIL Smooths Rough Ride

AMSOIL customer Lloyd Blazs of North Vancouver, British Columbia recently converted his bike to AMSOIL and has had excellent results. Blazs bought a new Honda Shadow VT750C and didn't think much of the shifting problems and excessive grab in the clutch. He thought a little tightness was normal in a new bike.

"After a very respectable break-in period of just over 5,000 miles, everything was broken-in and loosened up, yet I still had a clutch that would grab, resulting in lurching or stalling the engine," said Blazs.

Blazs was using conventional motorcycle oil throughout the break-in period, and considered synthetic oil as a possible solution to his problems. After considerable research, Blazs settled on AMSOIL 20W-50 Motorcycle Oil.

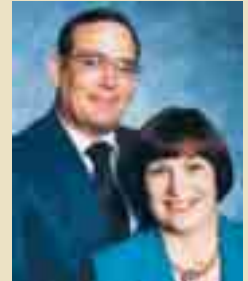

New AMSOIL Fogging Oil Offers Long Term Protection for Stored Equipment

Two- and four-stroke recreational vehicles, hand-held power equipment, small engines, construction and farm equipment are commonly operated seasonally or infrequently, then stored for long periods of time. During these periods of inactivity, and as a result of fluctuations in ambient temperatures, water vapor can form condensate within the engine. When this condensate comes into direct contact with steel and iron components, it forms surface corrosion on cylinder liners, piston rings, anti-friction bearings and steel/iron contact surfaces on rotational seals. Long periods of storage can also dry out cylinders, often resulting in permanent damage when the equipment is taken out of storage and dry started.

The severity of component distress resulting from extended storage varies, but it is usually not enough to result in immediate component failure. Often, equipment appears to function properly when put back into service, failing shortly thereafter as component distress increases with use. Because the failure doesn't happen immediately, the equipment owner often does not suspect storage-related problems.

The industry is beginning to recognize the relationship between storage-related corrosion and premature engine failures and performance problems. Most two- and four-stroke motor oils are formulated to have an affinity to engine component surfaces, acting as a barrier that keeps condensate from contacting engine components and forming corrosion. However, the effectiveness of motor oil in this area diminishes with time.

Two common methods are used to extend protection of stored components. One method involves placing motor oil directly on internal engine components, usually by pouring one or two ounces of oil into the engine cylinders through the spark plug holes and manually rotating the engine to

distribute the oil. The more effective, easier and cleaner method involves use of an aerosol fogging oil. Because it can be applied through the engine intake or carburetor as it is running, a fogging oil reaches and protects more components than a straight motor oil. In addition, the aerosol nature of fogging oil offers a more complete distribution of the oil than the straight motor oil method, something especially beneficial in applications with horizontal cylinder orientation, such as outboard motors.



A survey of manufacturers in the affected market reveals all have maintenance guidelines for long-term storage of equipment. Forty-three percent indicated special maintenance is required if length of anticipated equipment inactivity exceeds 30 days, while 43 percent indicated a time period of 60 days and 14 percent indicated a time period of 90 days. All recommended the application of additional oil to the engine for long-term storage, and more than half suggested the use of a special fogging oil.

New AMSOIL Engine Fogging Oil offers superior film retention, providing long-term protection against corrosion and dry starts, extending engine life and reducing operating expenses. Its aerosol spray formulation offers easy and clean applications, while reaching more components and offering better distribution than straight motor oil.

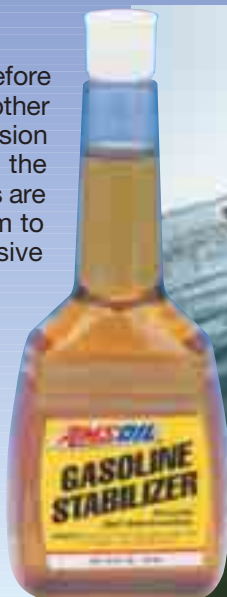

Gasoline Stabilizer

It is difficult to drain all of the fuel from equipment before storage, and doing so would expose the system to other problems, including the formation of rust and corrosion on the bare metal in the tank and fuel system and the drying and cracking of gaskets and seals. Some fuels are pre-treated with oxidation inhibitors that allow them to be stored for short periods without forming excessive deposits, while other fuels have no inhibitors at all.

AMSOIL Gasoline Stabilizer (AST) reduces the oxidation process that occurs when fuel is stored for extended periods. It prevents the formation of varnish and sludge which can clog injectors, stick floats and cause poor engine performance. AMSOIL Gasoline Stabilizer is ideal for stored season equipment such as snowmobiles, lawnmowers and boats. The treat rate is one ounce with every 2.5 gallons of fuel. One bottle treats 40 gallons.

The AMSOIL Motorcycle Oil Study (G-2156) compares the test results of 28 different motorcycle oils in the most critical areas of motorcycle oil performance, making it an excellent sales tool for Dealers seeking to either break into the motorcycle market or increase their sales. The March issue of the *Action News* took a closer look at the specifics of the Four-Ball Wear Test, while the April issue covered rust protection. This

issue examines gear wear testing.

Many motorcycle engines share a common lubricant sump with the transmission, requiring the same oil to lubricate both assemblies. Because engines and transmissions place different demands on lubricants, an oil that provides good engine protection may fail to provide adequate transmission protection. High sliding pressures, shock loading and shearing forces applied by motorcycle transmission gears place a great deal of stress on a lubricant, and it is up to the oil's viscosity and chemical additives to protect the gears against wear.

The ASTM D-5182 FZG Gear Wear Test is used to determine a lubricant's gear oil performance. Two hardened steel spur gears are partially immersed in the test lubricant, while temperature is maintained at a constant 194 degrees F and a predetermined load is placed on the pinion gear. The gears are rotated at 1,450 RPM for 21,700 revolutions before being inspected for scuffing. If the total width of wear on the pinion gear teeth exceeds 20 mm, the test is terminated. If the total width of wear is below 20 mm, additional load is placed on the pinion gear and the test continues for another 21,700 revolutions. Each time an oil passes, it advances to a higher test stage. The highest stage is 13, and results are reported as the highest stage passed by the oil. Wear is indicated for the stage at which the oil failed.

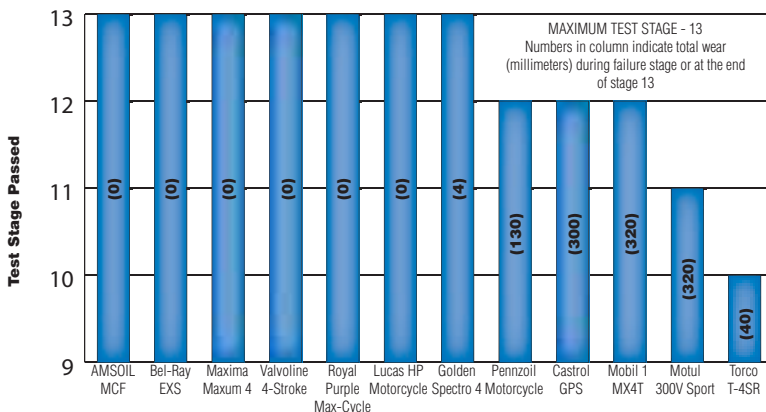
Two separate tests were performed for SAE 40 and SAE 50 oils, and results indicate that 58.3 percent of the SAE 40 oils and 75 percent of the SAE 50 oils passed stage 13. Although Mobil 1 MX4T, Motul 300V Sport and Torco T-4SR tested among the top SAE 40 oils in the Four Ball Wear Test, they tested among the lowest in the FZG Gear Wear Test. In addition, Motul 300V Competition and Torco T-4SR tested among the top SAE 50 oils in the Four Ball Wear Test, but also tested among the lowest in the FZG Gear Wear Test.

As seen in the photos and graphs, both AMSOIL 10W-40 Synthetic Motorcycle Oil (MCF) and 20W-50 Synthetic Motorcycle Oil (MCV) placed at the top of their

respective test groups in both the Four Ball Wear Test and the FZG Gear Wear Test, indicating that AMSOIL Synthetic Motorcycle Oils are the best choice for superior protection of motorcycle engines and transmissions.

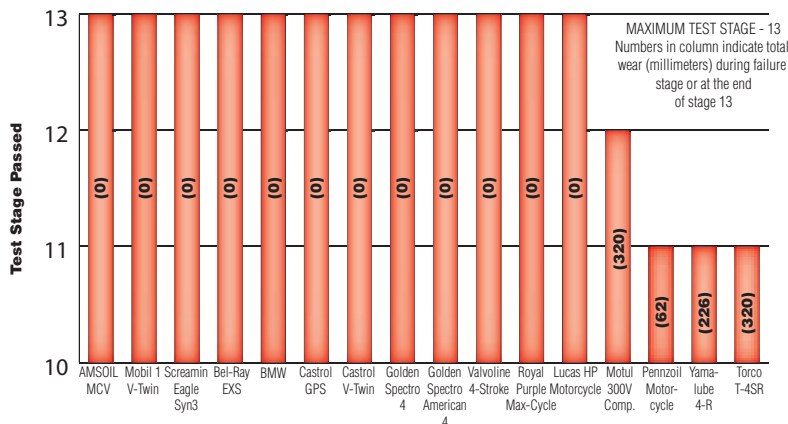

AMSOIL Offers New Display Booths

AMSOIL INC. is sharing half the cost of state-of-the-art indoor display booths with T-1 certified Dealers. Dealers who are not T-1 certified may purchase the displays at full price. A limited rental program is available to T-1 certified Dealers. The display booth options, in three sizes, offer versatility to Dealers for booths of all sizes.

Tier I – Trade Show Booth (G-2172)

The Deluxe SpaceStation fits 10' x 10' booth areas or larger. The frame is 90 inches by 10 feet. It features laminated mural print face panels that Velcro® to the frame, two floodlights and endwraps. The shipping case doubles as a podium with an AMSOIL logo wrap and a writing surface for taking orders. Wheels give it portability. Two 30" x 72" literature display stands, with a travel shipping case, are included. Four shelves 12" x 30" mount on the display stands and are Velcro® compatible. Total cost: \$3,346. T-1 certified Dealers pay \$1,718 (freight not included).

Tier II – Trade Show Booth (G-2173)

The Basic SpaceStation features an 8-foot wrap-around display with two floodlights. It includes the same podium with an AMSOIL logo wrap and a writing surface for taking orders.

Smith Sets Sights on 2006 Season

Late Model driver finds cooler temps by using AMSOIL

Brady Smith had a trying year in 2005. The late model driver took his AMSOIL-backed Chevy on the open road last summer, feeling all the bumps in the road that an open schedule can provide a young driver. But Smith took part in a number of high profile events, such as the WISSOTA 100 and the North-South Shootout. He also found that his switch to AMSOIL last year was a big reason for his 12 top-five finishes.

Running on the country's premier dirt tracks can put even the most finely tuned car through the ringer. Last year, our oil temperatures were around the 230-240 degree range. Our water temps even dropped about 15 degrees after switching over to Series 2000 20W-50 Racing Oil (TRO)."

Smith also relies heavily on Super Shift Racing Transmission Fluid (ART) for his transmission and SEVERE GEAR 75W-90 Gear Lube (SVG) for the car's rear end.

"We didn't have a single tranny-related failure last year," says Smith. "That helped us so much during
